Peter Jensen is the first rider to complete this list, adding the new entries as he went. His notes: The only mountain top I would advise caution on is Black Mountain in Maine. The "trail" to the top (locked gate) was at best a twin track mountain bike trail. It is used by 4-wheel drive vehicles for access to the antennas located on the top of the mountain, but is extremely difficult to navigate on a 400+ lb motorcycle. I would not recommend it be done solo as it is very remote and has very challenging sections with steep grades, loose rock and washouts. It might be better as an optional location for the true off-road riders; it is not a location where you should bring a street only bike. Other than that location, all of the other ones can be done on a street bike or dual sport with a little bit of a challenge.
